



GIRL SCOUT GOLD AWARD PROJECT BY CHLOE NUCCIO

Chloe Nuccio, a Teen patron, is organizing a year's worth of beginner technology classes aimed for Seniors. Chloe organizes the programs alongside Librarian, Ocaria DiMango. The classes are offered to all Commack patrons, every other week and some Saturdays. Patrons can come in and bring their own devices to ask questions and get 1-1 assistance using their device. One of the classes offered also includes volunteer Teens from the community who are gaining community service through assisting the Seniors during these classes. The program is a year long and will end June 2025. When the program is completed, Chloe will submit it for her Girl Scouts of America Gold Award Certificate.









EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT BY WYATT BODE

In the spring of 2024 three pine wood containers were built and donated to the Library by local Teen and Boy Scout, Wyatt Bode. In order to complete his Eagle Scout badge, Wyatt ensured that the containers would be utilized by the Library to offer educational programs and resources. Thanks to Wyatt, the Commack Public Library now grows their own vegetables and native plants during the warm months, and then donates the harvested food to the local food pantry at the SYJCC. The Library offers seasonal gardening classes to accompany what's growing in the containers and patrons get to learn about seed saving, growing their own food and sustainability.

2025-2026 PROPOSED BUDGET

- 2.25 % Budget Increase
- 2.34 % Tax Rate Increase

The estimated increase in the tax rate is \$.54 per \$100 assessed valuation which, based on a \$4,000 assessment, amounts to approximately \$21.60 for the year per household. This equates to less than \$1.80 per month.
